McKEE IS MANAGER.

Succeeds H. T. Durrett in Great Falls, Mont., Telephone Co.

The following item from a paper at Great Falls, Mont., will be of interest to Coos Bay people as Messrs. Durrett and McKee were former residents of Marshfield and because some Marshfield capital is interested in the companies referred to:

"Managing Director R. T. Durrett of the Great Falls Automatic Telephone company, at a meeting of the local stockholders held late Saturday afternoon, tendered his resignation which took effect January 1. W. F. McKee, who has been the auditor of the company since the installation of the system here last June, will have charge of the local office, while Thomas Couch, Jr., president of the local company, will have full charge of the property here. Mr. Couch will be assisted by General Superintendent H. R. Risley, who makes his headquarters in Butte.

"Mr. Durrett will retain his interests in the local company and will continue to make his residence in Great Falls, where his wife and son reside. After a short rest, he will assist Thaddeus S. Lane, one of the officers of the independent company, with which the local concern is affiliated, in the construction of other telephone enterprises throughout the state.

"The retiring manager has been connected with the local company for the past year, and during that time has devoted all of his time to the upbuilding of the Automatic telephone system in Great Falls and vicinity, in which he has been very successful."

FIRE AT RANDOLPH.

Mrs. Danaca Injured While Rescuing Baby.

The Bandon Recorder says: "In rescuing her baby from their burning home at the Randolph mill, Mrs. Thomas Danaca was seriously if not fatally burned, and on account of inhaling some of the hot fumes her throat was burned, and there is some fear that these injuries may prove fatal.

"Mrs. Danaca was away from the house at the time the fire was discovered, and as she entered the door she was met with a burst of flames

which nearly overcame her and burned her about the head and hands; but with her child's rescue in mind she bravely pushed on through the flames to where her child lay asleep and escaped through a window. The child is reported as being uninjured.

"The fire is supposed to have started from a defective flue, in the Danaca home, but the exact cause could not be ascertained.

The Danaca home was a complete loss as nothing was saved whatever, although the crew with hose of the Randolph mill came to the rescue as soon as the alarm was sounded.

"The fire spread to two adjoining houses, and with the help of the mill crew the belongings of the occupants were removed to places of safety, but were badly broken and damaged by the forced rough handling and water. The houses could not be saved and it took the combined efforts of everyone present to check the fire from spreading to other houses and the mill."
