## BILLY TAYLOR NOW MISSING

Smith Mill Hand Feared to Have Been Drowned Last Night.

Billy Taylor, a Smith mill hand, is missing, and residents of Eastside and Bay City believe that he was drowned while returning home from Marshfield last night. A boat adrift with only one oar, marks in the snow in the bottom showing a man had been in it and cries for help heard earlier are the basis for fear. Taylor with a number of mill hands were over town last night, yesterday being pay day, and is said to have been celebrating a little. Bill Smith, another workman, walked with Taylor ahead of others on the return. Smith got home all right but his recollections of the events of the evening are hazy and he can cast no light on Taylor's whereabouts. Residents of Eastside who heard the calls for help rushed down to Isthmus Inlet but the cries had ceased before they reached there and the boat adrift was all they found.

Today a number have been dragging around the mouth of Isthmus Inlet but have found no trace of the missing man. The tide was ebbing strong when Taylor is feared to have fallen in.
