### FOR POPULAR ELECTION.

Senator Borah of Idaho Delivers Address in Senate.

C., Jan. 20.—Supporting the resolution providing for the direct election of United States Senators, Senator Borah of Idaho, delivered his argument in favor of that system, and pointed out many of the alleged faults of the present system including the alleged bribery in securing the election of United States Senators, the barter in patronage and stated that at this time fourteen legislatures are dead-locked on the election of senators.

### FORTY LOST IN MINE.

COLUMBUS, Ohio, Jan. 20.—The United Mine Workers of America listened to the annual address of President Thomas L. Lewis. He advocated granting a charter to the Western Federation of Miners. The report showed that in the last ten years a total of \$8,089,986.16 had been paid out in support of strikes.

### SHUT ANARCHIST OUT.

Ohio Miners Will Not Permit Emma Goldman to Speak.

COLUMBUS, Ohio, Jan. 19.—Considerable stir was created in the United Mine Workers of America society today by the locking out of the convention hall of Emma Goldman, the anarchist. Late last night, after adjournment of the night session 150 delegates adopted a motion to hear Miss Goldman today. When she arrived at the convention hall the custodian said he had been ordered to lock the doors against Miss Goldman, whereupon Miss Goldman and about one hundred delegates adjourned to another hall where she spoke.
