THE DOG'S DAY.

EVERY dog has his day, and the day of the unlicensed dog is past. The genial cur of the street, which is on friendly terms with nearly every sort of contagious malady, is a menace to Marshfield's safety as well as health.

Marshal Carter has seen this. Soon, it is said, a census of the dogs will be taken to find out those which have the right to live and separate them from those which do not have the license tag, the fiat of the owner that his dog is worth enough to watch over and protect his dog. After this methodical procedure, Marshal Carter may decide to kill the outlaws and arrest their owners.

Last year Constantinople, after allowing his dogs to increase for centuries, was forced to do away with them. The queer religious tenet that forbade the killing of the dogs had long been an obstacle to sanitation and health. But this was overcome by a compromise. The dogs were banished to a barren is-

If you own a dog and do not pay the license before February 5, Marshal Carter will catch you.
