**Boys Liberty.**—The Smith-Powers Logging company has bought the steamer Liberty from J. C. Gray, representing a number of claim-holders against the boat. The vessel was bid in for \$1,550 and it is expected this will pay about seventy-five cents on the dollar.

**Exams Next Week.**—Through an error, it was stated the first semester examinations in the Marshfield public schools were to be held this week. They will open next Wednesday and continue the balance of the week. The North Bend school examinations were held this week.

**Is Bankrupt.**—Notices have been received here that Jas. W. Duncan, formerly of the North Bend Furniture company, has been duly adjudicated a bankrupt in the federal court at Portland. The first meeting of his creditors will be held January 26. Duncan left Coos Bay some time ago.
