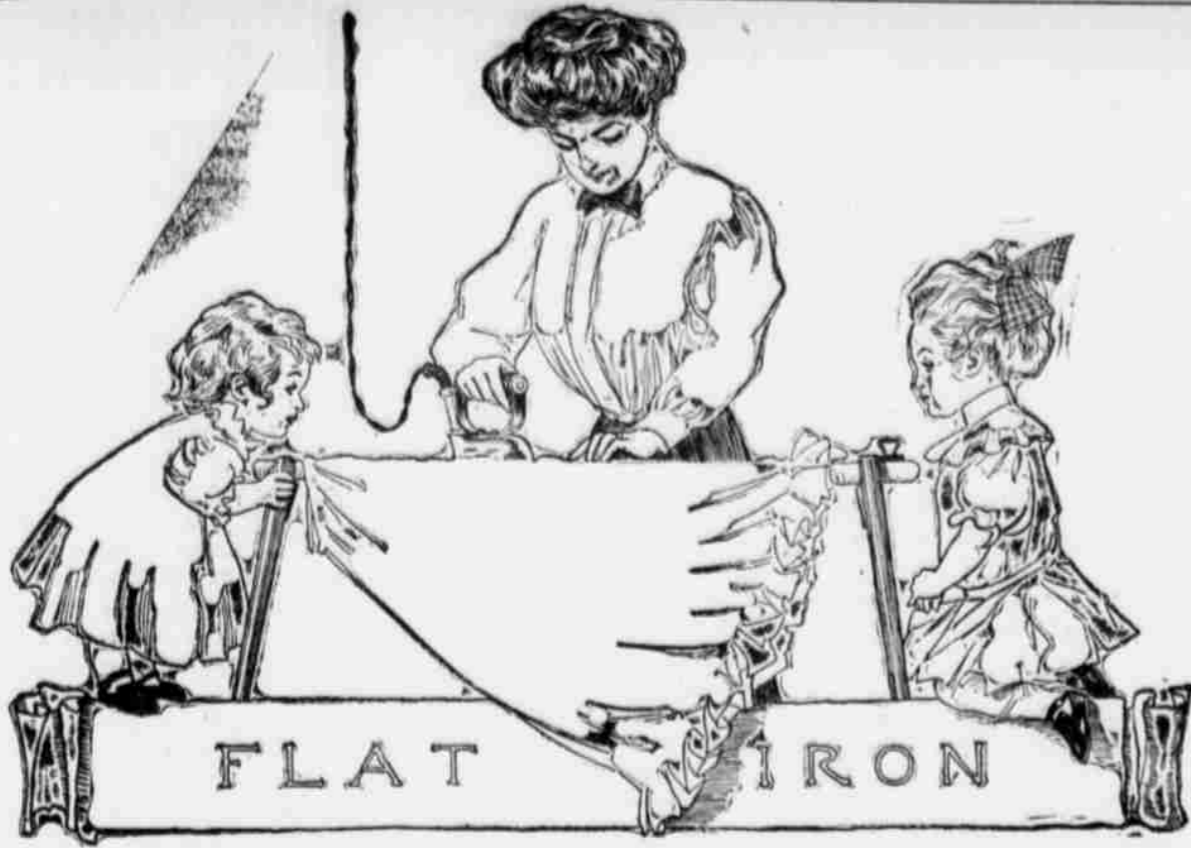

### WHISTLING BUOY FOR COQUILLE

Aid to Navigation Ordered Established Off River.

PORTLAND, Ore., Feb. 11.—One of the most important items in a budget of information received from Washington by Commander J. M. Ellicott of the 17th lighthouse district, was that he had been granted authority to proceed with the purchase and installation of a combination gas and whistling buoy off Coquille river. The location is said to be an excellent one for the establishment of such a mark and it undoubtedly will be appreciated by navigators.

### PLAN FOR CANNERY.

Stock Company at Myrtle Point Forms Temporary Organization

The Myrtle Point Enterprise says: Subscribers toward the stock for the purpose of securing a fruit and vegetable cannery for Myrtle Point met at the city hall Wednesday afternoon. An executive committee of five was elected, consisting of R. C. Dement, C. E. Huling and T. D. Guerin. This committee is to select a site for the cannery, get water on the ground and oversee the construction and equipment of the factory. Afterward action toward incorporation was taken. It was agreed that the name of corporation should be the "Myrtle Point Canning company," principal place of business at Myrtle Point; capital stock of \$15,000, and a board of five directors to be elected at some future meeting. H. B. Steward, Lloyd Spires and W. E. Pike were named as the incorporators.

The meeting adjourned to meet again on the 8th day of March, when it is expected that they will be ready to complete the incorporation proceedings.
