LOGGED OFF LANDS.

AMES J. HILL once made the statement, and proved its accuracy with figures, that a quarter section of good timberland in Oregon or Washington would produce as much tonnage for a rallroad as the same amount of land sown to wheat would produce in 160 years. As the loggers of the Pacific Northwest are daily removing the timber from several square miles of land the importance of immediately getting this denuded forest land into shape to it may continue to productraffic is very great. A number of companies have been formed in Oregen and Washington for the express purpose of clearing off these loggedoff lands and placing them in condition for crop-producing. In Southwestern Washington, one company mione is said to have in its possession 20,000 acres of logged-off lands and will immediately begin clearing and placing them on the market.




