NEW TAX PLAN.

Multnomah County Scheme Is Adopted by Douglas.

The sheriff's office is now very busy sending out the annual statement of taxes for the current year and papers that taxpaying be delayed for a week or so, until this work is completed. An improved system is being used this year, as these statements are in the form of a receipt in duplicate. When returned or brought in with a remittance for taxes it saves the time of writing an entire new receipt, with description of property, etc. It has only to be signed, numbered in duplicate and the necessary entry made on the tax records, making a great saving of time over the old system. This is the same plan as is in use in Multnomah county.—Roseburg Review.
