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AMERICAN TROOPS ON THE MEXICAN BORDER.

HISTORY may not be repeating itself by the movement of American troops to the Mexican border, but the political atmosphere tingles with electric possibilities recalling the Cuban revolution and the Spanish-American war.

This is the third time that the United States have intervened in Mexican affairs. The first occasion was when the Texan republic and the southern slavepower brought about the war of 1848.

So long as this doctrine remains in the foreign policy of the United States it imposes on this country the moral obligation of preventing its territories from being used as a base for insurrections or rebellions against the established government of any other nation on the American continents.

The action of the American government is good for Mexico, good for our army and good for the United States.

It tends to strengthen the forces in Mexico that make for peace, prosperity and, in the long run, for really republican government.

It gives the American army much needed practice in playing the military game and becoming prepared for the possibility of acting to preserve peace and guard foreign interests in Mexico.

It assures the United States that their army is an effective force, neither a Quaker gun nor a skeleton.
