**Gown Renovating a New Profession.**  
In these days, when most occupations are overcrowded, a woman does well to start a new line of her own.  
A bright Chicago woman, Miss M. M. Franklin, has opened a shop many women would do well to imitate. She remodels old style gowns, taking large or small contracts, whether for shops or private individuals.  
The average dressmaker will not remodel old gowns. Many of them carry their prejudices so far that they will not even bring up to date their own creations of a previous season.  
Another woman who engages in this work makes a specialty of fashions, not from the originating, but from the remodeling point of view. Many women of fashion send her all the remnants of a new gown the moment it is made, and she keeps them until the gown is sent to her to be rebuilt on new lines. She also does alterations for customers who buy ready made clothes and dyes and rearranges old stage costumes to present a new effect.  
Many branches of this business readily suggest themselves, like the mending of fine lace, remodeling of lace robes which occasionally require the services of an embroiderer, etc. A woman who is a good cleaner could easily combine her business with this new field of work and remodel and freshen entire wardrobes.  
In these days of expensive gowns many women wish to wear them more than one season if they can be changed somewhat to escape recognition or to bring them up to date. They can afford to pay the renovator a good price and still be saving money.
