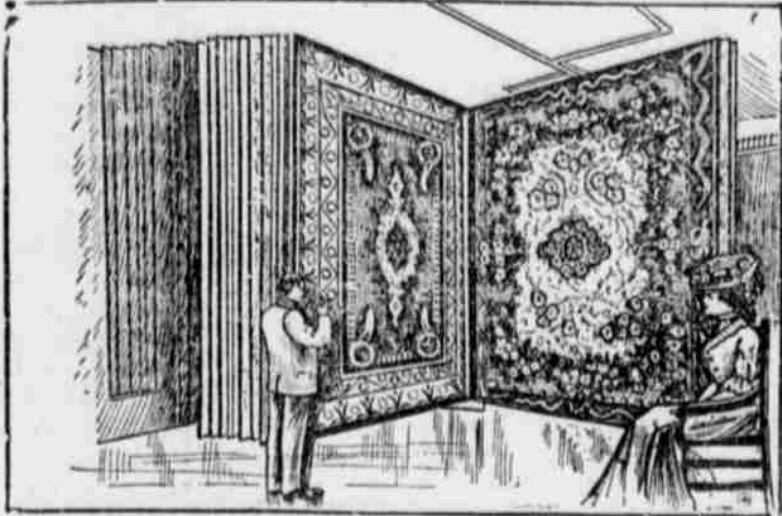

DING, DONG, BELL. CAT WEARS A BELL

Spokane Cats Must Look Absurd, Because 'tis Feared They'll the Bird.

A recent press dispatch says: Mrs. J. D. Murphy, living at 1827 East Riverside avenue, is advocating a movement in Spokane that all owners of cats provide their pets with bells in the interest of preserving the birds of song, which are now coming back to their haunts for the summer. Mrs. Murphy has interested a large number of club and society women in her campaign and it is likely that a "Bell on Cat" society will be organized to take charge of the work. The plan is to attach a small bell with a strap or ribbon on the neck of every cat in the city and suburbs, the argument being that if it were made a custom generally there would be more birds in Spokane. No mention has been made so far of the tinkling at midnight serenades by Thomas and his backyard acquaintances, but it is no wild guess at this time to say that some one may organize a crusade to not only put the bells out of commission, but also exterminate the wearers. The theory advanced is that this method would make doubly sure of protecting the birds for all time.
