REAL ESTATE WOMAN IN PORTLAND TROUBLE

Lena Riviere of Portland, Well Known On Coos Bay, In Trouble In Rose City.

The following from a Portland paper will be of interest to many on Coos Bay on account of Miss Riviere, being well-known here through visits on the Bay:

"Following a stormy scene in the office of Keasey, Humason & Jeffrey, in the Chamber of Commerce building, Lena Riviere, once a teacher in the Couch school, was called as a defendant in Justice Bell's court yesterday, on a charge of disturbing the peace. A postponement was secured.

"Last Friday Miss Riviere went to the office of D. C. Keasey and began throwing ink bottles and other missiles at him. A case of flowers struck Keasey on the head. Harrison Allen was present and sought to act as mediator, whereby he came in for a share of the volley. Then, say the complainants, Miss Riviere lay down on the floor and kicked and screamed. A complaint was made against her by Captain Silva, superintendent of the building, and she was arrested by Deputy Constable Wertheimer, who found her ill in bed in her quarters at a downtown hotel."
