MILL TO OPEN SOON.

Rebuilding of Coquille Lumber Mill Nearly Completed.

The Coquille Herald says: " The mill was operated three days last week, during which time they sawed enough lumber to finish repair work about the mill, and also sawed 25 or 30 thousand feet for the new mill. They closed down again the last of the week and are now engaged in putting on the finishing touches pre-\$2,000, terms half cash.—Title paratory to getting down to business in earnest in a few days. They expect to be running full blast by about the 10th of the month. The conveyors are being finished up and some repair. About 15 men are employed at present, but eight or 10 more will be needed when they get to running steadily."
