FORMER Governor Folk of Missouri is preaching the initiative, referendum and recall as he goes about the country. Governor Foss of Massachusetts advocates the same innovations in government; also the direct primary for all offices, including those of United States senators. Governor Johnson of California declared strongly for all of these radical changes in the first official statement of his views and policies. Undoubtedly, the tide is running in the direction which these conditions indicate. There is a growing demand for the most direct government which can be devised in a country as large as the United States. The old method of transacting public business at open meetings of all the citizens, which served well in the little towns of New England, and in small Swiss cantons, two or three of which still cling to it, is out of the question, of course, in big cities. There it becomes physically impossible.
