BANK GUARANTY LAW SUCCESS IN KANSAS.

WITH Governor Stubbs and the progressives in control of the machinery of government the phrase, "What's the matter with Kansas?" has ceased to be an interrogation and has become an exclamation of delighted approval...

J. N. Dolly state bank commissioner is authority for the statement that the law has brought from stockings, tin cans, holes in the wall and cracked teapots more than \$600,000 hoarded by persons who were afraid to trust the banks.

Only one bank has failed since the United States supreme court permitted the law to be put in operation. This failure was caused by a defalcation of \$100,000 in the Abelen State bank.

There is \$727,500 in the guaranty fund. The banks pay one-twentieth of 1 per cent each year until 10 assessments are made.

This piece of progressive legislation has so far been a complete success and its practical operation has confounded all its "special privilege" critics.

EXTERMINATE THE FLIES.

THE following suggestions offered in an official Bulletin by the Chicago Board of Health will be found valuable by Coos Bay people in combatting the fly evil:

To begin with: Screens, of course. Screen also all food, especially milk. Pour kerosene liberally over all garbage.

If you have a stable, do not let manure stand. Chloride of lime on manure will keep flies away. But this is expensive. Remove the manure every day.

Place in each room of the house saucers containing diluted formaldehyde. Two teaspoonfuls of formaldehyde in a pint of sweetened water will form a supply for several rooms.

Another effective agent is pyrethrum powder. When there are flies in the room shut the doors and windows and pull down all the shades, leaving one so that the light comes through a small slit at the bottom.

Go over your premises every day and prevent the accumulation of garbage, filth, dirt. Sweep out behind doors and radiators. Report to the department of health any neighbor who neglects to remove stable manure or garbage, or who keeps his premises in filthy or unhealthy condition.

Keep your garbage in closely covered cans. Don't be afraid to use kerosene in them all the time. Don't let milk stand in unscreened receptacles. Keep it on ice all the time, or at least covered up in a cool place. Burn all refuse.

At the special session of the county commissioners last week E. G. Perham was awarded a contract for building 362 feet of rock road on the Allegany road. The contract price was \$1,170. The particular portion of road passes around what is known as Jackson's Bluff and is entirely in rock.

The saw mill of the Coquille Mill & Mercantile Company again started sawing yesterday and it was announced that this was the start for permanent operations. During the last shut-down many small matters have been arranged and three heavy conveyors have been installed at the mill to take care of the saw dust, slabs and refuse of the mill.

County School Superintendent Bunch will start out next week on his regular spring tour of the schools of

the county. He will visit the Bridge School as the first on his list and will then visit other outlying schools and finish his work with the larger and more centrally located schools.

County Treasurer Dimmick yesterday forwarded \$16,302.93 to State Treasurer Kay at Salem, this being the first half of the state taxes for this year. The balance will be forwarded in October.
