WATERWORKS IS DISCUSSED

North Bend City Council Wants Joint Meeting With Marshfield Body.

At the meeting of the North Bend city council this week, the water question was up for discussion and after more or less debate, it was decided to try and hasten the joint session with the Marshfield city council for the purpose of remedying the situation.

Mayor Simpson has received plans and estimates from a Portland engineer relative to the present system, its value and what could be done with it if the cities should buy it. The plans call for putting a filtration system, reservoirs, increasing the supply, enlarging the mains and putting in good ones, etc. The details of them were not given out at the meeting.

Mayor Simpson will try and arrange with Mayor Straw to call a special meeting of the Marshfield council so that the matter can be gone into in detail. The Marshfield council will hold a regular meeting next Tuesday night but owing to the volume of other business to come up, it is desired to have a special meeting.

To License Vehicles.

The North Bend council also enacted an ordinance for licensing teamsters and all kinds of vehicles. It is modeled closely after the new Portland vehicle ordinance.

No other business of importance except the allowing of bills, etc., came up.
