Upon his arrival in Sacramento he was taken by his daughter and several friends who had accompanied him to one of the fashionable cafes.

Mrs. Burrell guarded her father closely from public scrutiny during his appearance on the public street. He recognized him, although the crowd was passing rapidly around that time. His daughter is a bright-eyed, well-dressed woman, and proved an excellent foil to outsiders who attempted to intrude upon the seclusion in which she wrapped her father.

She is truly loyal to her father and said: "My father is a gentleman. They couldn't take that away from him."

Particular at Home.
