BENNETT ON BARBOUR CASE

Makes Statement in Reply to That of John C. Merchant Yesterday.

After reading what John C. Merchant said in last evening's Times regarding the Merchant tract and Barbour deeds to Railroad Addition, J. W. Bennett made the following statement:

"A covenant of warranty in a deed, or as they are commonly called 'warranty deeds', means only the return of the actual purchase price paid. It does not require the payment of one dollar for improvements made on the lots, or one dollar for the increased value thereof, and does not even require the payment of interest on the purchase price as the use of the lots offsets the use of the purchase price. Neither does it cover street improvements, sewers, etcetera.

If the rule was otherwise a man giving a warranty deed to a \$50.00 lot might have to pay for a ten thousand dollar brick or a ten million dollar sky scrapper beside the \$50.00 he

got for the lot, and that would put most of us on the colon bacilli wagon.

"The lots purchased from Mr. C. H. Merchant have greatly increased in value and the improvements put thereon by the purchasers fully exceed the value of the Merchant estate, and even if all of the heirs were willing to make good, irrespective of the law, there would not be anywhere near enough to do so. Mr. Barbour has never asked anyone to get a quit-claim deed from him, and the only reason one can be obtained was through my own suggestion so that the sales of property would not be prevented during the litigation as parties could perfect the paper title for the nominal sums mentioned in my letter in The Times of last Tuesday. Then again litigation is both expensive and tedious; for instance look at the Port case after they got through fighting one friendly suit and one unfriendly suit the Port Commission themselves petitioned the governor to start up something else so that all of the original appointees might die or their terms expire before the port plums became digestible.

"The present suit was brought by the Merchant Land Company and their lawyers must have thought it necessary in order to make the title good to the unsold lots, but does not seek to remove the cloud from the lots already sold, and there is not a lawyer in town or anywhere else who will say the paper title is a marketable one without the Barbour deed. If someone is to make good, why not make good now!"
