Jack Haley, Formerly of Margaret Iles Company, Ends His Life There.

WAS ELOPING WITH MRS. C. E. MORRIS

Logging Camp, 15 miles from Myrtle Point, committed suicide in a room at the Roseburg hotel early this morning by shooting himself in the head with a revolver.
