MAINE WRECK NOW IN VIEW

Begin Pumping Water Out of
Coffer-dam Around
Submerged Ship.

(By Associated Press to Coos Bay Times.)

HAVANA, Cuba, June 6. — The work of pumping the water out of the coffer dam which was built around the wreck of the battleship Maine was resumed today. The greater part of the after deck is now cleared and visible, showing confused masses of wreckage covered with marine growths. The forward part of the ship on which the greatest force of the explosion was exerted is still submerged. It is the intention of the civil engineers to proceed slowly with the pumping until evening and then suspend operations until the arrival of the Board of American officers tomorrow after which the work will proceed rapidly.

Schooner Harriet Rowe, wrecked January 1876, at Port Orford. Value, \$8,000.

Steamer Victoria, wrecked at Cape Blanco, Nov., 1883. Value \$161,640
Schooner Mose, wrecked May, 1884 at Port Orford on Fort Point Rocks. Value \$5,400.

Schooner Napa City, wrecked 1887 north of Cape Blanco. Value \$6,000.

Schooner Grey Hound, wrecked Dec., 1887, on north Point of Port Orford. Value \$6,000.

Steamer South Portland, wrecked October 19, 1903, at Cape Blanco, with a loss of seventeen lives. Value \$62,000.

on manufactured woolen imports and duties as the estimate for 1912, would be 42.55 per cent compared with 90.10 per cent under the schedule of 1910 and the average ad valorem equivalent of duties on raw wool 20 per cent as compared with 44.31 per cent in 1910. All the democratic members of the Ways and Means committee with the exception of Francis Burton Harrison of New York signed the report.
