The reception was held in the church parlors. Addresses were delivered by Rev. H. E. Sandstedt of the Augustana Lutheran church, Rev. Allan Lease of St. James' Lutheran church, Dr. P. W. H. Frederick, president of the Lutheran Theological seminary, F. W. Longren, A. Bedin and David E. Lofgren.

"Rev. Olsen came here from Marshfield about two months ago to succeed Rev. C. J. Renhard, who resigned, but his wife died from an attack of pneumonia, just as they were preparing to leave Marshfield for Portland and in company with his wife's parents he took a trip to his former home in Nebraska."
