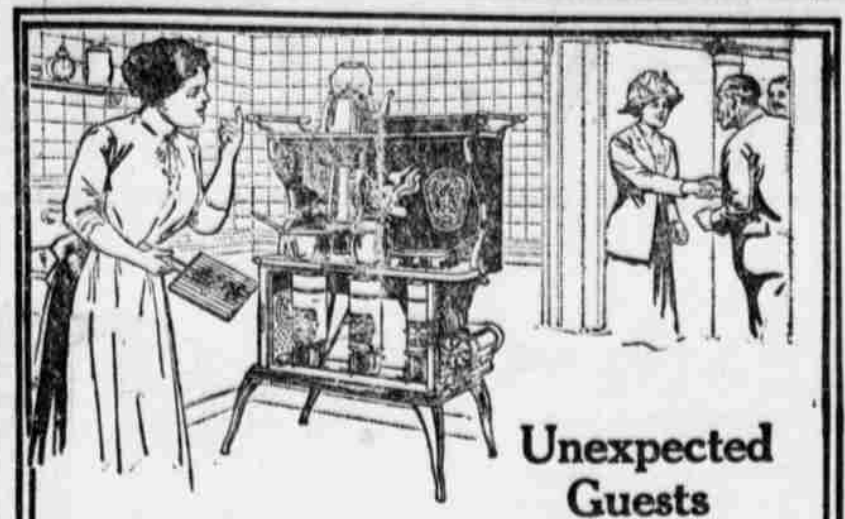

RESTORATION TO ENTRY OF lands in National Forest.—It is hereby given that the lands described below, embracing 721,495 acres, within the Siskiyou and Siuslaw National Forests, Oregon, will be set to settlement and entry under provisions of the homestead laws of the United States and the act of June 11, 1906 (34 Stat., 232), at the United States land office at Roseburg, Oregon, on July 25, 1911. 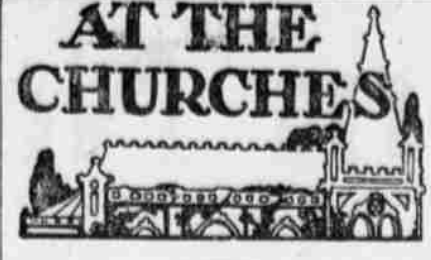
