### POST IS COSTLY.

Try to Abolish Collector of Customs at Coos Bay.

WASHINGTON, D. C., June 12.—Assistant Secretary of the Treasury Curtis, in a hearing before the House Committee on Expenditures of the Treasury Department, has suggested the enactment of legislation for the abandonment of numerous customs' ports of entry not paying the expenses of maintenance. In Oregon these ports are Coos Bay during the last fiscal year were \$1,335, costing \$267 to collect each dollar of duty. At Yaquina the expenses were \$1071, with no collections. Curtis suggested making these ports subports of the port of Portland, but legislation will be necessary to do this.
