

## AMENDMENT DEFEATED.

> WASHINGTON, D. C., June 21 .---By a strict party vote of 172 to 113 the House refused to accept Senator Bristow's amendment to the resolution providing for direct election of United States senators.

Agent C. F. McGeorge of the Al-Hance Steamship Company, received a telegram from C. P. Doe, general manager of the Northern Pacific Steamship Company, announcing that the Alliance would make a special trip from Eureka to Sau Francisco. On her roturn trip the Alliance will leave San Francisco on Saturday next, arriving In Cons Bay Monday. afternoon. The Alliance is now on her way to Euroka, and will thenco second directly in San Francisco.

About McGoorge bi not advised as to the reasons for the Interruption in the Pertinnel achedule of the Alliance Thir in allooling circles it is taken to being added to the Cons Imy run by the Northern Pacific Steamship Commany. The steamer Kilboura of the North Pacific floot will be in commission July 1, and steamship men point to the possibility of the Alliance cun being extended to San Francisco and the addition of the Santa Clara to the Coos Bay fleet on the same run. This would give a greatly improved San Francisco steamer service.
