LORIMER CASE IS OPENED

George W. Hinman, Editor of Chicago Inter-Ocean, Says No Money Was Used.

WASHINGTON, D. C., June 22.—George W. Hinman, editor and publisher of Chicago Inter-Ocean, was the first witness today before the Senate Committee investigating the election of Senator Lorimer. Hinman said he was a close friend of Senator Lorimer, but he had received no money to be used in his election. He stated he believed there had been a jack pot in every legislature in Illinois since he went to Illinois twelve years ago, but he had never talked with anyone who had contributed to the fund or who had received money from the fund.

SENTENCED TO TWELVE YEARS

F. E. Duez Convicted of Embezzling \$1,200,000 Is Sent to Prison For 12 Years

PARIS, France, June 22.—Ferdinand Edmund Duez, receiver of the dissolved religious congregations, was convicted yesterday of embezzling \$1,200,000. He was sentenced to twelve years imprisonment to hard labor. Duez was judicial administrator of the civil tribunal of the department of Zetu. He was in charge of the liquidation of the property of thirteen of the congregations dissolved by the association law of 1901. In March 1910 Duez confessed to the embezzlement of \$2,000,000, and was held for trial. The total value of properties which Duez was liquidating had been appraised at \$212,000,000, and the government expected they would yield \$200,000,000 out of which the old age pension voted by the parliament could be paid. When Duez was arrested about half of the liquidations had been made and the total sum actually turned over to the treasury was only \$1,461,331.

LIQUOR MEN BACK RECALL

Roseburg People Believe Judge Coke Is Fought by Anti-Prohibitionists.

A recent press dispatch from Roseburg to the Portland Telegram says: "Roseburg is not giving general support to the movement initiated in this city to recall Circuit Judge John S. Coke of Marshfield, because of his instruction to the jury that acquitted Roy McLallen on May 27 last, of the charge of murder in the second degree. While it is not disputed that the instructions of the court were not as complete for the prosecution as they were for the defense, few voters consider this sufficient reason for invoking the recall against Judge Coke and few are signing the petitions for that purpose."

It is outspoken opinion of many citizens that the real animus behind the movement lies with the radical anti-prohibitionists, who display undisguised hatred for Judge Coke because he imposed a fine of \$500 on three beer-sellers at the recent term of court. Six others indicted on a like charge face the same evidence that convicted the first three and the natural presumption is that they, too, will be fined the limit. The nine comprise the whole number of soft-drink dealers in Roseburg.

The recall petitions are being circulated under the direction of E. L. Cannon, a Socialist attorney, of this city. He says ample funds are being pledged to defray the expense of such work. This judicial district is composed of six counties, Douglas, Coos, Curry, Lane, Lincoln and Benton. Within its confines are about 20,000 voters and the signatures of at least 2 per cent of these must be affixed to the recall petitions before the election may be held.
