"Only Question Involved Was **Union Pacific a Competing** Line?" Says Court.

(By Associated Press to Coos Bay Times.)

ST. LOUIS, Mo., June 24. - The merger of the Southern Pacific and Union Pacific railroads is legal according to an opinion handed down today by the United States circuit court in the eighth district.

Judge Hook filed a dissenting opinan auto trip with some Portland real ten in which he expressed a belief that the government's petition was well founded and should have been granted.

The majority decision was written by Judge Elmer B. Adams and was mailed to the clerk of the court here. "The only question," read the opinion, "was whether the Union Pacific Company was a competing line prior to 1901 for transcontinental business with the Southern Pacific Company, whose line extended from New York on the east over the sea to New Orleans, thence by rail to San Francisco and Portland on the West." "While the Union Pacific was only dependent on the Southern Pacific for its connection westward, the Southern Pacific was not at all dependent upon the Union Pacific for a connection eastward," read the majority opinion which goes on to say that the purchase of the Southern Pacific by the Union Pacific did not amount
