TO ELECTRIFY CLIMATE.

STEP by step man invents machines and processes to do or supplement the work of color, heat, light and sunshine in growing crops, says an exchange. A generation ago the blue-glass craze of General Pleasanton of Philadelphia, who imagined that blue glass fostered the growth of plants and flowers, formed a crude step in this direction. Fruit growers have for years fought frost and created artificial, temperate climates by fires in orchards and vineyards. Now artificial daylight is manufactured by a lamp that distills vapor from quartz mercury, the rays possessing the same quality as sunlight and exerting the same influence on growth. It is only a question of time when science will acquire such control of electricity that it can modify climate over large regions.

MRS. O'DONNELL ACQUITTED.

Bunker Hill Blind Pig Case Decided In Pennock's Courts.

At the request of Assistant District Attorney L. A. Liljeqvist, Justice of the Peace C. L. Pennock yesterday dismissed the charge of selling liquor without a license preferred against Mrs. Fannie O'Donnell, formerly proprietor of the Breakwater rooming house in this city but now a resident of Bunker Hill. Lack of sufficient evidence upon which to base a conviction was the reason assigned.

Elsie Bahlman, who makes her home with Mrs. O'Donnell at Bunker Hill, and who was arrested at the same time on a similar charge, was bound over to the grand jury, bail being set at \$200.

According to the testimony brought out at the hearing of the case against the Bahlman woman before Justice Pennock yesterday afternoon, S. Anderson, John Runqvist, Gus Berg, and Oscar Pierson, all employees of the Smith lumber mill, admitted having visited the house occupied by the two women in Bunker Hill and with having been served with liquor while there.

One witness admitted having presented Miss Behlman with a fifty-cent piece when she served the drink but added that he had not tendered the money in payment for the liquor but as a present to the girl.

The four witnesses were placed under bonds of \$50 each to appear before the grand jury.
