Louisiana Senator Declares "Farmers Shouldn't Be Buncoed."

(By Associated Press to the Coos Bay Times.)

WASHINGTON, D. C., July 7. — "The only plausible meritorious claim for the passage of the Canadian reciprocity bill was withdrawn by President Taft at his recent address at Indianapolis when he said the bill would not diminish the cost of living," declared Senator Thornton of Louisiana, a democrat, today, in addressing the Senate. Thornton said the farmers of the country should not be buncoed by the enactment of the bill, that that bill was not a Democratic measure and therefore he felt free to carry out his pledge to the people of Louisiana in voting against it, even if he did not follow his party in the Senate in so doing. Thornton advocated a reduction of duties on shoes and woolen fabrics.

The deceased leaves two sisters and one brother to mourn his loss. The Rev. H. I. Rutledge of Marshfield officiated and delivered a sermon which was a beautiful and touching tribute to the life of the deceased and to the old soldier. Interment was in the Dora cemetery the old burial custom being observed the mound of new earth was banked high with beautiful flowers tokens of love and esteem from the neighbors and friends of the last call was sounded, and the choir sang the old but always beautiful song "Shall We Gather at the River." One more boy in blue has crossed over the great Divide to meet his Maker. He leaves to mourn his death two sisters and one brother and other relatives and friends.
