## COQUILLE TRIMS THE SAND CRABS

COQUILLE, Ore., July 11.—The Bandon ball team followed by nearly a half-dozen rooters came to Coquille Sunday determined to clean up the local aggregation, but had to return with the short end of a 12 to 3 score.

Dipple, the imported slab artist, started to pitch for the visitors but soon ran into a bunch of trouble with the "top ear" strikers and retired in favor of Ingram who tossed a nice article of ball until the eighth when he weakened and allowed 5 runs to score.

As usual Coquille's hitting was a feature. The heavy stick work of Johnson Lorenz, Liljeqvist, Oerding and "Tad" Collier won merited applause, Oerding especially shining for three times when hits meant runs he responded with a bludge.

But the bright particular star of the game was Pitcher Collier who had the visitors "eating out of his hand" the entire nine innings. He had everything curves, speed and control and the opposing strikers were completely at his mercy. Striking out 16 men allowing but 5 scattered hits is some pitching.

The Coquille infield showed marked improvements and pulled off some fast snappy plays.

While the visitors startled the spectators with two double plays and the fine work of McNair and Holman in the outfield were features.

The Bandon team impressed the fans by the clean article of ball they put up and the sportsman-like manner in which they took their defeat. The same teams meet next Sunday at Bandon.
