Also the importance of buying the nursery stock from reliable source, and of getting the stock planted early, preferably in December, but never later ly prepared drawings Mr. Newell illustrated the proper method of pruning the young tree, both before planting as well as during the first two or three years' growth. "Head the young tree at about eighteen inches in height, and don't permit the branches to come out too close together," said the speaker.
