produce the extremely large potatoes, but the hills that produce a large number of medium sized tubers should be selected.

Prof. Kent discussed the subject of "better cows", stating that a western Oregon creamery man had reported one patron who sent the cream from a herd of fourteen cows for one month and received therefor a check for \$16. Not \$16 per cow, but for the whole herd. Another patron sent to the factory all the cream produced by a herd of nine cows for two days, and received for the same the sum of sixty cents. In contrast to these extremes of low production the case of a cow producing 4.9 pounds of fat in two days, worth at creamery prices at the time, \$1.78 by actual weight and test, was cited, as an instance of why "dairying don't pay."

Prof. Kent was followed by Mr. Newell who dwelt at some length on the importance of getting started right in fruit growing. The importance of using medium sized one year old trees in planting the young orchard, was pointed out. Also the importance of buying the nursery stock from reliable source, and of getting the stock planted early, preferably in December, but never later than April 15. By means of carefully prepared drawings Mr. Newell illustrated the proper method of pruning the young tree, both before planting as well as during the first two or three years' growth. "Head the young tree at about eighteen inches in height, and don't permit the branches to come out too close together," said the speaker.
