\$76.76 was paid Oregon Power Company for lighting 962 lamps and \$118.09, labor for putting up and taking down lights, streamers, flags, etc.	
Decorating committee spent \$134.34 for decorating purposes; there is left for future use, material worth \$92.19 and this, together with about \$250.00 worth of lamps, wires, fixtures, etc., makes a total asset of \$342.19, which are at the disposal of the city at anytime for future celebrations.	

At a recent meeting at Chamber of Commerce, it was resolved that a vote of thanks be extended through the columns of The Times, to all the business men of Marshfield who did so much toward making the celebration a success, sacrificing their business that Marshfield should have one of the most glorious Fourth of July celebrations Coos Bay has ever known. Particular attention was also given to the Fire Department for its work, vote of thanks extended and committee appointed to draft resolution of thanks.

Marshal Carter was not overlooked for his efficient work and also that of his assistants and the two days' celebration was not in the least marred by lack of careful attention upon his part.

The committee also wish to thank Mr. F. B. Tichenor of Portland for his courtesy in assisting whenever called upon. Mr. Tichenor decorated the window for the Chamber of Commerce and also delivered the Fourth of July oration.
