The people of the United States second. were given no opportunity to express themselves upon this subject. It was forced upon them by the president and congress, whether they would or no.

No party in England or any English possession can remain in power an hour after the people have decided to take the matter into their own hands. The English have both the Initiative and referendum in the most practicable and workable form known.

It may not be patriotic to admit it. but under the English system there is much more direct appeal to the people than there is under the American. The English government is more democratic, the American purely representative.

Reciprocity will be settled in Canada by direct popular vote. In this country it has been settled by combinations of politicians, all of them guessing how best to promote their own personal fortunes in the deal.

The referendum is at the very basis of the English parliamentary system. Where the English fall down is that their ballot is not as free as ours. But that is ada.
