LIFE INSURANCE COMPANY'S NURSING SYSTEM SAVING LIVES.

THE VALUE of the nurse as a factor in prolonging the lives of people who periodically suffer from attacks of sickness in one form or another is so generally known that it is not to be wondered at that a life insurance company has organized an army of nurses as part of its duty to look after any of its policyholders.

In taking care of sick policyholders this life insurance company evinced a foresight so businesslike and humane that it deserves to be imitated by other life insurance companies the world over.

The nursing staff of this life insurance company made its first visit in June, 1909. During that month 751 visits were paid.

In June 1911, the number of visits paid number 58,201 and the total number of visits for the first six months of this year reach the substantial figure of 329,777, while the cases nursed amount of 10,543.

The nursing system is giving such great satisfaction that nursing services are being organized in every part of the country and when the system is completed and in perfect working order it is estimated the yearly cost will be \$500,000. At present nearly 100 cities are covered.

Five hundred thousand dollars may seem a large sum to expend on nursing for policyholders each year, absolutely without charge, but as the company has already found that the death rate in the cities in which its nurses operate has shown a falling off, the expenditure seems fully justified.

MORE RUMORS OF RAILWAYS

Claim That Contractors Are Figuring on Early Construction Eastward.

Several new railroad stories are afloat in Marshfield today and it is claimed that they are pretty well substantiated, and tend to confirm the stories printed in The Times a few days ago about contractors figuring on starting construction here soon.

One story is that a certain contractor has been here getting estimates on railroad construction material and that another has been securing terms from some of the steamers plying in here on hauling an entire construction outfit to Coos Bay from San Francisco. It is further declared that the contractors are not Southern Pacific contractors, and that they figure on starting work this fall.

No public statement has been made by the Coos Bay and Eastern Electric people nor by the Coos Bay and Boise that would shed any light on the above rumors.

One Coos Bay man who has been looking into the matter stated today that he was positive that a steam line and an electric line will be built directly east from Coos Bay in addition to the Southern Pacific line to Eugene.

Nothing further has been heard from J. P. O'Brien as to the date on which he may visit Coos Bay.

BREACH IN SENATE.

C., Aug. 17.—Another political chaotic condition in the Senate developed today when the democrats disregarding the caucus action and through the deliberate aid of the regular republicans put through by a vote of 28 to 25 the iron and steel amendment offered by Bacon to the cotton bill. The progressive republicans voted against the Bacon amendment, though it was identical with the Cummins amendment because it implied a breach of faith of the democratic-progressive republican alliance.

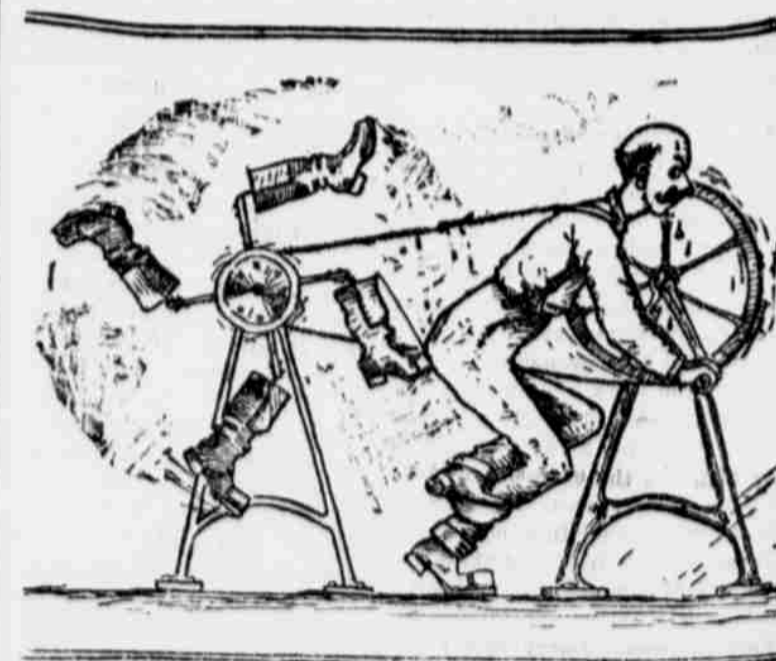
