PLAN TO ANNUL OLD FRANCHISE

North Bend City Council Wants to Revoke Privileges Granted Seymour H. Bell.

It is expected that the North Bend city council will at its next meeting take steps to revoke the street car franchise which Seymour H. Bell holds in that city. The franchise was granted several years ago and a condition was inserted in it that Mr. Bell didn't have to build until Sherman avenue was opened up through to Marshfield. Relying on this, it is understood that he maintains the franchise, which is declared by some to be almost a "blanket" proposition, is still valid. City Attorney Mullen is now investigating the legal steps necessary for the council to declare it

This is a step preliminary to the council taking action on granting a franchise in Marshfield and which is in the interests of the Simpson Lumber company, C. A. Smith Lumber company, W. S. Chandler, J. W. Bennett and J. H. Flanagan.

The city council was informed of Judge Coke's decree prohibiting the city of North Bend from collecting more than \$135 per lot for the Delaware street improvement. Under this restriction, the city will have to pay \$1,225 of the \$1,765 costs.

The Breakwater did not get out early yesterday morning as early advises yesterday indicated. Last evening. Supt. Miller received a wire from Portland saying that the Breakwater sailed from there at 5:30 p. m. or early in the morning.

The gasoline schooner Patsy, almost an exact duplicate of the ill-fated Oshgosh, sailed yesterday from the Kruse and Banks shippards at North Bend, where she was built, for Yaquina where she will be inspected. She was built for the Nehalem & South Coast Transportation Company and the engine sof the Oshkosh, which was lost last winter on the Columbia bar, were installed in her. Geo. May, the only survivor of the Oshkosh disaster, is chief engineer on the Patsy Capt. Hanson is master of her. C. H. Dean mate and A. J. Rich assistant engineer. The name of the boat is made up of the first letters of the ports which she will ply between that is Portland, Astoria, Tillamook, Siuslaw and Yaquina.
