

# ELOPERS MAY BE ON BAY

### Mrs. F. Cheesbro and Wm. Simpson Thought to Have Come Here.

The Roseburg Review prints the following: It became known yesterday that Coosburg was the scene of an elopement last week, the principals being Mrs. F. Cheesbro, wife of the Southern Pacific section foreman at Comstock, this county, and William Simpson, who has been employed as a clerk in a store at Myrtle Creek conducted by Mrs. Cheesbro's mother, Mrs. J. Fritts. At the request of Mrs. Cheesbro's husband, who came to this city Sunday, the local authorities are now trying to locate the couple, who are accompanied by the woman's two children, a 9-year old girl and a 4-year-old boy. Simpson is about 27 years of age, while Mrs. Cheesbro is a year older.

Mrs. Cheesbro left her home at Comstock last Tuesday, ostensibly to visit her mother at Myrtle Creek. After spending a day at Yoncalla, she came on to Roseburg and was met here on Wednesday evening by Simpson, who had quit Mrs. Fritts' employ without notice, taking along \$120 which may or may not have been due him as wages. The couple left Roseburg with the two children either that same evening or Thursday morning. It is believed the couple fled to Coos county, as a man and woman with two children are known to have been passengers Thursday morning in an outgoing automobile en route to Myrtle Point.

Cheesbro says his wife and Simpson first met on a farm near Yoncalla a year ago, when she attended him during a spell of sickness. Later he says, he noticed that they were on very friendly terms, but he never dreamed of what the future was to bring forth. He knew nothing of the elopement until Sunday morning when the information was imparted by Mrs. Fritts, who had been told of the affair by Mrs. Cheesbro's sister-in-law, Mrs. Boseley, of Cottage Grove, who was present at the meeting between the elopers in Roseburg and was requested to say nothing about it.

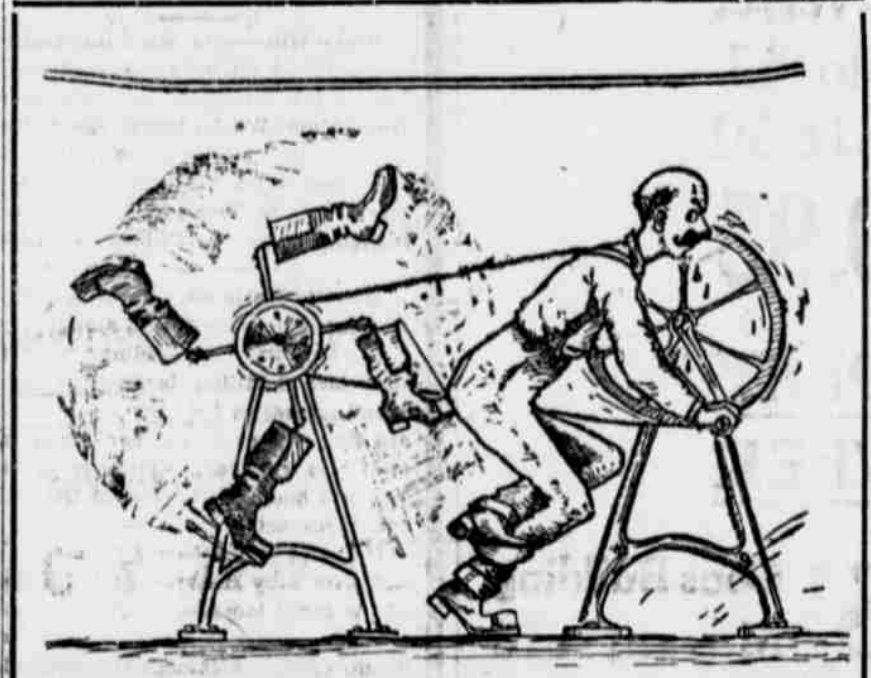
