ALLEGES FRAUD IN LOCAL DEAL

F. W. Kern Sues Niehaus Estate on Account of North Bend Box Factory.

The following Oakland, Cal., press dispatch will be of interest to many Coos Bay people who are personally acquainted with the parties mentioned and also because the North Bend Box factory is the property named in the suit:

"The late Edward F. Niehaus, formerly a wealthy Berkeley furniture manufacturer, is accused of fraud in a suit filed before the superior court by Frederick W. Kern. The fraud is alleged to have been committed in the purchase of a furniture factory at North Bend, Ore. Kern claims that Niehaus induced him and D. O. Druffe to put money into this enterprise on the representation that the property would cost \$40,000, and that this was a reasonable price for it.

"Subsequently, Kern claims that he found that Niehaus only paid \$30,000 for the whole plant, and he asks that \$5,000, which he claims he was wrongfully induced to put up, be returned to him. The suit is directed against Mathilde Niehaus widow of the dead man, as executrix of his will. Niehaus disinherited his only child, a son, Edward H. A. Niehaus, but the son was given half of the large estate after he had begun a contest of the will and the evidence produced showed that the instrument would be broken. Mrs. Niehaus, the young man's mother, had become embittered against him because of his marriage, and it was shown that she strongly influenced his father against him. Spiritualistic seances, in which the elder Niehaus saw visions of his son in the possession of a devil, fringed largely in the testimony in the will contest."
