### NORTH BEND NEWS

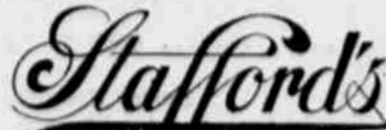

**President In**—The President arrived in today from the Coquille with a shipment of lumber, dairy products and other freight.

**Leave Today**—F. W. Davis, J. P. Dunham, Robert Cleveland, Mr. and Mrs. Mecklenberg were among the outgoing passengers via Sumner by the Roseburg stage this morning.

**Nann Smith In**—The Nann Smith arrived in today from Bay Point and will load at the Smith mill. There were no incoming passengers on her.

**Left Wednesday**—F. B. Tichenor, Miss McKenzie, N. Jensen and J. P. Gillette and wife were among those leaving on the Coos Bay-Roseburg stage Wednesday.

**Boston in Columbia**—The United States training ship Boston crossed into the Columbia river yesterday afternoon after a good trip up the coast, according to advises received here today.

**Aston Returns**—Engineer Aston of the Coos Bay and Eastern Electric Co., returned last night from a trip to Roseburg and a visit at his four surveying camps. Mr. Nevers remained in Roseburg but will probably return tomorrow.

**Family Makes Up**—In a letter to Justice Pennock, Mrs. Fred Muetzel of Ten Mile asks him to dismiss any charges she preferred against her husband when she was in town last week, securing assistance of the officers. This is thought to indicate that the Muetzel family troubles have been settled again.

**Appeal Submitted**—The appeal in the case of Frank Garrison, under death sentence for the Perkins murder here a year ago, was submitted by briefs to the Oregon Supreme Court this week. It will probably be some little time before a decision is secured. Some have been talking of endeavoring to get Garrison's sentence commuted to life imprisonment in case the appeal fails.

**To Improve Inlet**—Simon Erickson, Julius Larson, Wm. Blackmore, Joe Sullivan and Wm. Forest have returned from Coquille where they appeared before the Coos county commissioners yesterday in an endeavor to secure an appropriation for improving Larson's Inlet. The commissioners agreed to appropriate \$1 for each dollar residents of the inlet will raise. About \$1,650 has already been raised there so that the work will probably soon start. The desire is to dredge it back for about three miles from the mouth.
