IN MAINE.

AFTER many fluctuations the final returns of the Maine election seem to show a small majority in favor of the repeal of the prohibitory amendment.

As has been before stated this vote by itself does not change the situation in Maine, for there is the act of the legislature making the prohibition of the constitution effective, 'in on the statute books. The legislature must meet and replace the prohibitory law with some other law.

It is altogether likely that the legislature will repeal statewide prohibition, however, for it will be the legislature that resubmitted prohibition to the people, and the evident purpose of that was to get rid of the law.

The future course of Maine will be watched with interest in every state that has a liquor problem.
