We will never bring disgrace to this, our city, by any act of dishonesty or cowardice, nor ever desert our suffering comrades in the ranks; we will fight for the ideals of the city, both alone and with many; we will revere and respect our city's laws, and do our best to incite a like respect and reverence in those above s who are prone to annul and set them at raught; we will strive unceasingly to quicken the public's sense of civic duty; thus, in all these ways, we will transmit this city not only not less, but greater, better and more beautiful than it was transmitted to us."
