ROME, Italy, Sept. 29 .- It is officially announced here that Italy Albanians Want General Garibaldi to and Turkey are in a state of war beginning at half past two on the afternoon of Friday, September 29. The reason given is that Turkey has failed to meet the demands contained in the Italian ultimatum.

The minister of marine is believed to have sent wireless orders to the Italian fleet of Tripoli to act immediately.
