That the work can proceed this winter was stated to be possible because a considerable distance between Coos Bay and the mouth of the Sluslaw is through sand that can be more easily worked in winter than in summer and also that a number of tunnels could be driven during the winter weather.

Get Right of Way
 Representatives of the Terminal Railways are now negotiating with several for right of way needed for that line outside of the city of Marshfield. The survey is being pushed vigorously by Chief Engineer Sahlberg and it is announced that some of the construction will possibly be done this winter.
