The trouble the ordinary storekeeper is up against is securing this salesmanship on paper I have outlined. He can purchase advertising space readily enough and so long as he buys enough space for a long enough period to make a successful display he has done all that the suscessful merchant can do in that respect. But when it comes to filling the space the question assumes a different shape.
