FINE SERMON
BY DR. KNOX

Who Asks: "If a Town Is Dominated by the Devil Can It Prosper?"

The sermon at the tabernacle last night in the people's evangelistic campaign, now being conducted in our city, was delivered by Dr. J. T. M. Knox, pastor of the Presbyterian church. Dr. Knox had just returned from the annual meeting of the Synod and was filled with his message to the great edification of all his hearers.

The speaker took as his text First Corinthians, the second chapter, which reads: "I am determined not to know anything among you save Jesus Christ and Him crucified," and delivered a fine sermon, every part of which was filled with lucid illustrations couched in the splendid diction which marks the minister's style.

He said in part: "When the great Paul makes the declaration that he was determined to know nothing but Jesus Christ, there are some today who would say at once that Paul was narrow and begot. Such people seem to have no room for Jesus Christ in their lives. There are popular churches now that in the race for popularity, conduct some evening services and actually leave Christ outside. Every text in that Bible points to Jesus Christ and every service is a failure unless it does the same. The trouble with people today is that they are taking the Bible and trying to make it conform to their own crookedness instead of making themselves conform to the rectitude of the Bible. Why I say to you that God's word is the most up-to-date book we have, and it is your business to know the principle character in it, Jesus Christ, who is the center of all history.

"Paul said: 'I am determined.' Now, everyone knows that the seat of the determination lies in the will. Unless you will to know you are not likely to know. This meant that Paul places Jesus Christ first in the attainments of his own personal will. This marks the true follower of Christ. The man who prefers money before God is not pleasing in His sight. The man who places social functions first cannot be a true follower of Jesus Christ. What dominates and rules you in life? Can a town be dominated by the Devil and prosper?"

"The meaning of Jesus is deliverer, and the meaning of Christ is king, then to know Jesus Christ is to know Him as just the person He is, the Deliverer, King. Thousands bow the knee to Jesus the perfect man, but not as the deliverer king. Paul's determination was to know Him as the Redeemer King. Here we see the atoning love of Jesus, and what has been wrought in this world without atonement? Someone has said that Drummond was wrong when he wrote that love is the greatest thing in the world. Atoning love is the greatest thing this world has ever known."

The minister went on to explain that atonement was written even in the skies. "Not written," said he, "in the English language or the language of any country, but in the language of God which everyone, if he is determined to know, may read. And if a person knows Christ as He is, then Heaven opens its portals to receive into everlasting glory that one whose redemption was accomplished in the Son of God. But the man who has no place for Christ in his life, is forced to die a Christless death."

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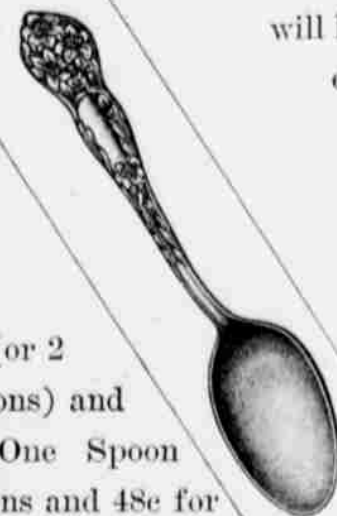
