

# TRADE QUIET BUT HOPEFUL

**EASTERN CITIES TALKS INTERESTINGLY OF BUSINESS CONDITIONS—ALL WANT TO KNOW ABOUT COOS BAY.**

"While retail business is quiet in the East, everywhere there is a hopeful feeling and the only effect is a marked conservatism," said A. W. Myers to a Times' reporter today. Mr. Myers has just returned from several weeks spent in Boston, New York, Philadelphia, St. Louis and Chicago.

"Everywhere I found a sentiment of optimism concerning the Pacific coast and particularly in the wholesale and jobbing districts where they are in direct touch with trade conditions on the coast. Business men who knew said that the situation here was many times better than in the east and they were all agreed that business would continue to improve here, all attributing the activity to the prospective opening of the Panama canal. I found a surprising interest in the Coos Bay country and incidentally I was able to do considerably boosting as a result of the many inquiries I received. While in New York I stopped at the Waldorf-Astoria where I registered from Coos Bay. As a result every day I would receive cards from a half-dozen to a dozen callers all anxious to learn something of the Coos Bay country. Some of them were merely speculators but all had heard of this section and its resources and possibilities and wished to learn more.

"As a result of the quiet tone of the eastern markets I found it the best time I have ever known for purchasing goods. In some instances I found I could buy at almost my own price and made some excellent purchases.

"You may say I am glad to get back to Coos Bay and nowhere in my eight or ten thousand miles' journey did I see anything that could surpass it in either present conditions or with brighter prospects."

Mr. Myers said that there was nothing new in his plans for enlarging his business here, but that he would take the matter up immediately as more room for displaying goods is absolutely essential. One of the finest stores to be found in the country is Mr. Myers' ambition for his Marshfield establishments and it may not be long before the ambition is realized.

Mr. Myers enjoyed a visit at his old home near Harrisburg's Pa., with his parents, saw the big eastern auto races but missed the world's series baseball games.
