### LAST GAME OF SEASON HERE

#### Marshfield and North Bend High Schools Ready For Hard Contest Saturday

Football enthusiasts are looking forward to Saturday's game, between the Marshfield and North Bend High schools, with a great deal of interest. It will be the first game this season between the rival teams and each will have a large number of supporters. From the games played so far, it would seem that the schools are about evenly matched, each having won from the Myrtle Point team and also some minor contests. Marshfield is determined to hold up its past record and North Bend is equally determined to be the first high school team to capture a football contest from the Marshfield boys. In five years of playing, Marshfield has not had a single defeat chalked up against it by a high school team and during that time it has won from the other high schools of the county. North Bend has made a splendid

showing so far this season and will strengthen its team with Van Zile, who has been out on account of injuries. Coach Honska has been putting his team thru some special practice this week and will have every man in fine form.

Clarke, both being in the game after an absence of three weeks. Larsen has been punting in fine shape and Stutsman can be relied upon for holding down the quarter back position in old time form. On the ends C. Clarke, G. Johnson and Jensen are all good men while the tackle and guard positions are being held down by Walters, Curtis, Carlson and Kruse. Walter is a new addition to the squad and will prove to be a very valuable man. Seaman is easily making good at center and with Byerby, Stead, Flanagan and Patterson on the side lines, Marshfield will have as fast an aggregation as it has ever put out. "Puskey" Johnson, who was injured in the Myrtle Point game, will be a loss to the team, but it is hoped he will be able to don a uniform before the season is over.
