RUSSIAN RULE IN PERSIA NOW

Czar to Appoint Chief Officials and Establish Court in Tabriz Soon. (By Associated Press to Coos Bay Times.) ST. PETERSBURG, Russia, Dec. 28.—The appointment of a Russian governor and chief of police for the city of Tabriz, Persia, and the assumption by Russians of financial control of municipal affairs there, together with the instruction of exclusively Russian courts of law, are foreshadowed today in the semi-official Novo Vremya.
