

During the year, 134 volumes for adults, 56 for childoen and six reference works were purchased, 73 volumes for adults and 18 for children were donated the library, making a total of 1911 volumes on the shelves at the end of the year 1911.

The total number of borrowers at the end of the year was 1058 of whom 576 were adults and 482 ch? dren. During the year, ten card-holders withdrew while 262 adults and 261 children were added to the list of patrons.

Fiction is the greatest domand for reading. During the last twelve months, adults borrowed 6434 volumes of it and childron 436s. number of volumes of non-fiellen etr-culated during the year was 1762 for adults and 1714 among children.

The library subserflues for sixteen current magazinos and receives eight others as gifts and all told receives thirty-four periodicals.

During the year, three hould were discarded, four were lost, of which two were paid for by the partles los Ing them.

For maintenance, the libeary received \$900 from the city during the year, \$258.70 in prits and \$135.79 in fines. At the close of the year, the fibrary had \$112.40.


