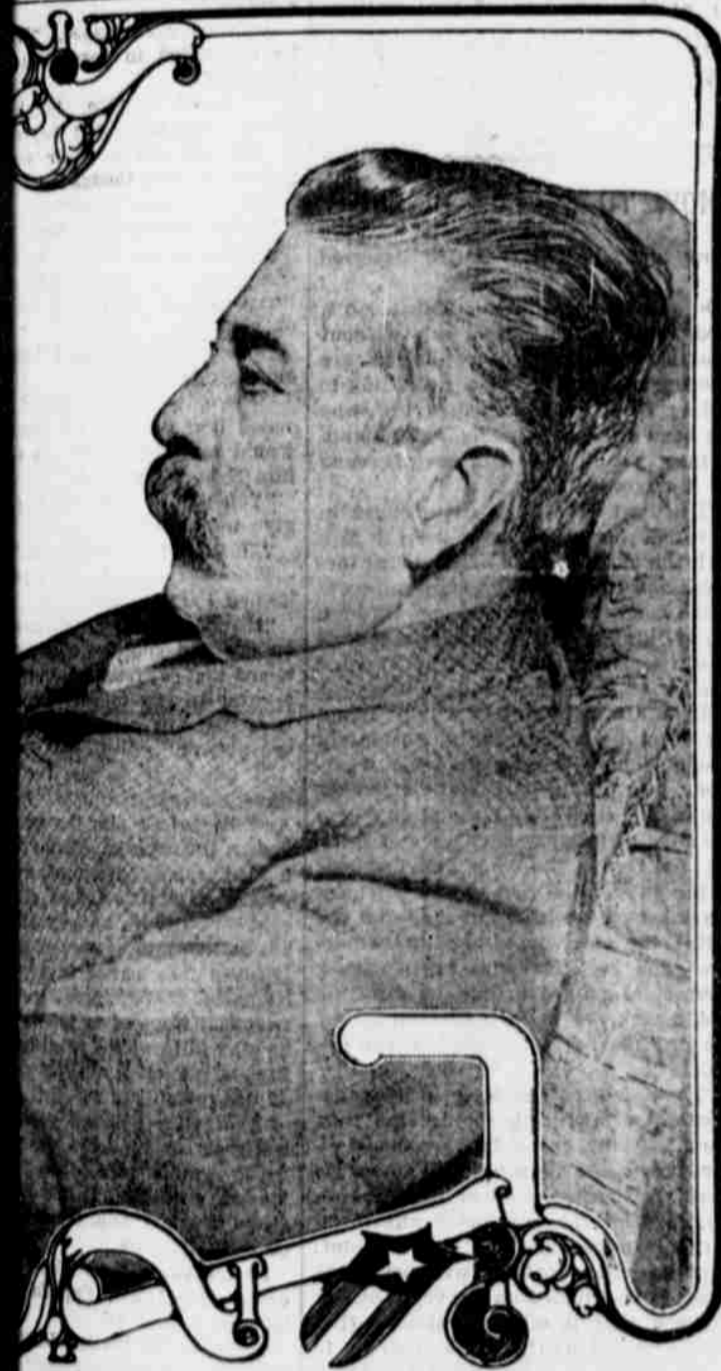

EVOLUTIONARY talk has broken out again in Cuba, but it does not appear to indicate serious developments. The republic of Cuba has been deliciously peaceful since the inauguration of President Jose Miguel Gomez Jan. 28, 1906. General Gomez, fought in two wars for the independence of his native island, succeeded in the administrative chair Provisional Governor Charles E. Smith, who was sent down to take charge of Cuban affairs when the States found it necessary to intervene for the maintenance of order. General Gomez first ran for president in 1906, but resigned his office. An uprising followed which resulted in the deposition of Gomez and intervention by the United States. Gomez is a native of Santa Clara province, of which he served as governor.
