LAWLESS REIGN ABOUT MUDKEN

Northern China in State of Anarchy and Brigandage—Many Crimes Reported.

MUKEN, Jan. 30.—The police of Mukden have systematically been raiding the homes of prominent men suspected of being in sympathy with the revolutionists, assassinating them and carrying off their wives and daughters, according to a letter from a missionary in that city, received today.

Consular reports confirm the accounts of scores of murders nightly. Large bands of robbers are holding up and plundering travelers on the roads leading into Harbin and and torture and kill victims who cannot meet their demands.

TWO ARE ARRESTED Leaders of Strike at Lawrence, Mass., Plead of Guilty.

LNWRECE, Mass., Feb. 1.—Joseph K. Etter, leader of the strikers, and his principal assistant, A. Giovanni, editor of a New York Socialist paper, pleaded not guilty to the charge of being accessories in the murder of Anna Loposso, the Italian woman who was shot Monday night.

GETS LARGE SUM Suspect in Canadian Bank Robbery Case Fight Extradition.

LOS ANGELES, Feb. 1.—A determined fight will be made by Charles Dean against extradition in connection with the new Westminster Bank robbery. Dean is said to have received a large sum of money from a mysterious source and if the hearing March 5 results in an order for his removal to British Columbia, he will carry the matter to the Secretary of State and to the President.
